TEST ONE OF DISCIPLESHIP MATURITY

Relationship #1 - "Who is Your Lord?"

A careful study of the transformation of the Apostle Paul, from a brand new Christian (Acts 9) into a mature disciple of Jesus Christ (Acts 28), reveals that there were six key relationships he maintained which contributed significantly to his spiritual growth. The failure for a Christian to have and work on these relationships will severely hinder his or her ability to become Christ-like as has been commanded by The Word of God (Luke 6:40; Matthew 16:24; 1Peter 2:21; 1John 2:3-6).

The first and most important question for every human being concerns LORDSHIP. Who gets to be the "lord" (i.e. "captain", "ruler", "leader", etc.) over your life? To what person or ideal have you given the authority to determine the agenda for the next 24 hours, much less the rest, of your life? Whoever is in charge of what your plans, goals, and decisions are throughout your daily life... is the "LORD" (i.e. "master") of your life. Paul, in Acts 9:5, called Jesus "Lord" and allowed Jesus to change his plans, goals, and decisions from that moment on. Who is YOUR Lord?

 - Are you sure you are really saved? If you are, you are in danger of severe "discipline" by Jesus if you do not repent and make Him your true "Lord"! (Hebrews 12:4-6)
