 - A. If it Never Happened, P<u>reaching</u> and F<u>aith</u> is W<u>orthless</u> (vv. 12-15; Acts 2; Acts 4; Acts 13;
 - B. Since it Did Happen, Preaching and Faith is Wonderful (vv. 1-4; Rom 10:9-15; Eph 3:7-8)
- III. Eternal Implications of the Resurrection of Christ
 - A. If it Never Happened, We have a Right to be Lawless and Hopeless (1Cor 15: 16-19, 32)
 - B. Since it Did Happened, We have a Responsibility to be Loving and Holy (vv. 20-22; 1Jn 4:9-11; 1Pet 1:3-16)
- IV. Emotional Implications of the Resurrection of Christ
 - A. If it Never Happened, then Death has D<u>efeated</u> our L<u>oved</u> Ones and S<u>ense</u> of J<u>ustice</u> (1Cor 15:18; Rom 12:19)
 - B. Since it Did Happened, then Death will be Destroyed by our Lord and Sustain our Joy (1Cor 15:22-26; Rev 20:14; 1Thess 4:13-18; 1Pet 1:6-9)
